THE LAKE LUCERNE SHUFFLE (EVERYONE IS DOING IT)

Well most everyone. Most are doing it on Saturday morning. What? You aren't doing it? What is it? Why it's the Saturday morning shuffle down to the dock in your waders with a handful of tools to "raise the dock again." Yes, water levels are going up every week. And that's a good thing! We are just about back to normal. Whoopee! So what's going on with the fish on our lake?

Recently the DNR planted about 11,000 Lake Trout in our lake. This is part of the DNR'S Long Term Plan to maintain the Lake Trout in our lake. This will continue every few years as the budget allows. Below is a chart of recent stocking.

<u>Year</u>	Age Class	#Stocked	Mean Length
2005	Large Fingerling	6565	6.4"
2012	Yearling	7833	6.7"
2013	Yearling	5110	7.1"
2017	Yearling	11572	7.3"

Future stocking is planned for 2018, 2020, and 2022.

This fall's plans are to stock about 10,240 walleye large fingerlings 7 to 7.5". Again the DNR plans to continue stocking on odd numbered years as long as funding is available. So far walleye survival appears to be below expectations. Your association is working with the DNR to stock forage (Cisco) to provide more and better quality food to improvewalleye survival. We would provide funding for this as the DNR has no funding available. There are a lot of hoops to jump through to make this happen so it may not happen till next year.

Also at our membership meeting we will have on the agenda a discussion on building new cribs. There is a cost for this both in materials and permits so it will have to be voted on.

At the DNR spring meeting it was voted and passed to change the minimum from 14" to any size for bass. PLEASE NOTE, THIS GOES INTO EFFECT 2018.

We will also discuss at our membership meeting the placing of tagged Bass with a prize of about \$500.00 or \$1,000.00 if you catch one with a tag. We also plan on putting signs at the boat landing suggestion catch and cook bass to improve the balance of game fish in the lake. Our reasoning is walleye and bass are competing for the same forage, less bass means more forage for walleye.



Myth #1 If it is pretty or beneficial it can't be a problem

Not true. Purple loosestrife is beautiful in bloom, but replaces other wetland plants. Reed canary grass was once widely planted to turn "worthless wetlands" into forage production areas for cattle. Now, a large percentage of the once biologically rich marshes and meadows in the state are largely blanketed by this one grass species that provides little useful wildlife habitat or forage.



Myth #2

All exotic species are spread by "natural" mechanisms such as birds and the wind.

Not true in a majority of cases. In fact, people are a major contributor to the spread of exotic species from purposely introducing carp to North America to unintentionally introducing zebra mussels via ballast water and transporting Eurasian water milfoil by recreational boaters and anglers.

In attendance were; Larry Sommer, President Diane Braunreiter, Secretary, Rick Hermus, Treasurer, LexAnn Hitchcock, Vice President, and Board Members, Marc Blazich, Wayne Daul, and Jack Kloss. Board Member Sally Hickman was absent.

LexAnn moved to accept the agenda. Rick seconded the motion. All were in favor to accept it as printed.

Larry announced that Sally will be the coordinator for the newsletter.

NEWSLETTER

It was discussed who would submit articles and all were told to submit their articles to Sally and the Pioneer. Our goal is to get together on June 8th or 9th to mail the newsletters out.

MEET YOUR NEIGHBOR AND MEMBERSHIP MEETING

LIETHEN MEMORIAL

Larry showed us pictures of a stone planter that he is proposing. We are going to keep the flag we have, but get a new flagpole. We decided that we will save \$200 delivery fee on the flagpole by picking it up with Wayne's trailer, but we will have the stones delivered for a cost of \$125. The cost for the flat pole is \$967, and the cost of the stone is \$681, but should be a little less because the part in the middle which will not show will be cement blocks instead. We will put patio blocks under the whole thing to keep it level and stable. The quote for a 6''x6'' curved brass plaque is going to be compared to a flat one from another company. Larry is going to get a quote for a flat plaque and then a decision will be made. We discussed that, in the future, some curved benches could be placed around the flagpole planter as additional memorials. We discussed doing the work ourselves, and Rick suggested that we hire someone experienced in stonework to oversee the project. Larry is going to call Gary Vanderloop to see if he is interested.
